He did have a few pet peeves, like people who don't listen, no work ethic, lack of common sense and disrespectful children. In the end, he is remembered by his family by his generosity, love for his family, his work ethic, "Big" presence, his sense of adventure, along with his get it done attitude, love of nature and most of all, his love for helping others.
