Bonnie L. (Haber) Pojar was born October 18, 1930 in Beemer, Nebraska to William and Adelaide (Wehrer) Haber. Bonnie was raised on the family farm near Beemer, Nebraska, where she attended a country grade school and graduated from Wisner High School in 1948. She also attended Midland College. Growing up, Bonnie helped out on the farm and often would ride a horse to school. She was also a trumpet player in the school band. Bonnie married Robert Pojar on April 29, 1958 in Hiawatha, Kansas and to this union, three children were born: Deb, Bob, and Tami. Bonnie and Bob raised their family in Empire City just south of Fremont before moving to Omaha and then Elkhorn in 1963. Bonnie had many jobs over the years, including working as a secretary with Farm Bureau Insurance, stocking shelves at Sears, and keeping the books for her husband's business, B & B Electric.

Bonnie and Bob enjoyed traveling together, and Bonnie always loved her trips to Vegas with friends. She attended her grandchildren's and great grandchildren's activities and volunteering at the VFW and Methodist Women's Hospital. Bonnie was a longtime member of the Zion Lutheran Church, the Legion Auxiliary, and the VFW Auxiliary in Millard. She was also a charter member of the Eagles Auxiliary in Elkhorn.

Bonnie was an avid Nebraska fan, watching many of the games in person or on television. She enjoyed fried chicken, a vodka sour, and a good meal at Alpine Inn or Big Fred's. Bonnie will be lovingly remembered for her spunky and strong-willed personality as well as her independent nature.

Bonnie passed away on August 26, 2018 at Brookestone Meadows in Elkhorn at the age of 87 years, 10 months, and 18 days. She was preceded in death by her husband, Robert, her parents, and her daughter-in-law, Vicki Pojar. Bonnie is survived by her son Bob, Jr. of Elkhorn; daughters: Deb Yarges of Millard and Tami (Matt) Macrow of Dyersville, Iowa; 5 grandsons and 8 great grandchildren; brothers Bill (Kathleen) Haber of Beemer and Terry Haber of Wisner, as well as many extended family and friends.
