Howard Michael Engstrom was born on December 20, 1949 to parents Carl Dean Engstrom and Delores Lena (Petersen) Engstrom. He had one sibling, his sister Vicky. He grew up in Urbandale, Iowa.

He worked as a general contractor while building three houses. He was a real estate agent, a deputy assessor, a loan officer, and an appraiser. He started his own business as a residential property appraiser. Howard was also a loving caregiver to his two children: Michael and Laura, his parents, his sister and in-laws.

He served in the U.S. Navy during the Vietnam War era from 1971-1973.

Howard enjoyed photography, fishing, bird-watching, organic gardening, traveling, reading, Christianity and the Bible. He had a real love and appreciation for all of God's creation and the great outdoors. He would often offer up a simple heartfelt prayer of, "Thank You, God!" whenever he would see a lovely sunset, twinkling stars, or an especially beautiful animal or flower.

He was an outspoken man of faith and prayer. He truly loved and believed with all his heart in his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Howard passed away on Thursday, May 3, 2018 at the Good Shepard Lutheran Care Center in Blair, NE. He was preceded in death by his parents. He is survived by his wife Kathy, his children: Michael (Heidi) Engstrom of New York City, NY, and Laura (Dermott Ferry) Engstrom of Council Bluffs, IA; three grandchildren: Zachary Engstrom, and Isla & Ada Ferry; and his sister Vicky Thomas.

He will be remembered as a true gentleman and for his kindness, love, encouragement, humility, and a delightful sense of humor. He will be genuinely missed by the many people who loved him.

When I needed a job to cover college expenses at Drake, Howard was able to get a position for me at the Skelly gas station in Urbandale where he worked, that was very generous. We studied together at the Grandview College library, he would come pick me up a couple of nites a week. When I needed a car, Howard made sure that I got first priority to buy Vicki's great 1964 Impala, my first car that I treasured and wish I still had! When Howard needed a job, I was able to get him a position where I worked at Land O' Lakes Dairy. What fun it was to work with him, we made such a great team there in 1970 & '71. He delivered a truckload of ice cream to Iowa State football games on those beautiful Fall Saturdays, I can still see him driving that big truck out of the plant headed to Ames and teasing him to be back before dark! I was very concerned for his safety when he went in the Navy in '71 and sailed on the Ranger carrier to Vietnam, so glad to see him well upon his return. He came to visit me in Chicago in 1974 and we stayed in touch for a while. I was so looking forward to seeing Howard at our Urbandale class reunion in September, as were many of our 1968 classmates. Take comfort in knowing that Howard touched many lives, it was so obvious that he had a Christian, loving and giving heart. I will always remember and cherish those special ten years we had together.
