Anne Reilly Dolan was born on June 18, 1938 in Washington, DC to James and Caroline (Wimsatt) Reilly. She grew up in DC where she graduated from Stone Ridge of the Sacred Heart Catholic High School in 1946 and graduated with a Liberal Arts Degree from Rosemont College in Pennsylvania.

Anne married Jim Dolan on June 18, 1960 at Lady of Victory Catholic Church in Washington, DC and to this union two children were born: Sherry and Reilly. Anne and Jim made their home in DC until 1984 when they moved to Omaha and moved again in 1996 to Yutan, Nebraska.

When they moved to Yutan, Anne became involved in the training and raising of quarter horses on their farm, Jimando Farms, which became one of the top Quarter Horse breeding farms in Nebraska. She was a passionate golfer, was a docent at the Henry Doorly Zoo, enjoyed riding and fishing in Colorado and traveled 7 continents. She was active in animal and wildlife associations and was instrumental in the formation of the Omaha Mounted Patrol. Anne was a vital and energetic woman who traveled all over Nebraska and annually rode in the River City Roundup trail runs. While she was committed to all of these, her true love was her grandchildren and the precious time they could spend together.

Anne passed away on March 11, 2009 at her home near Yutan, Nebraska at

the age of

70 years, 8 months and 21 days after a long and courageous battle with cancer. She was preceded in death by her parents James and Caroline. Anne is survived by her husband Jim; son Reilly of Washington, DC and daughter Sherry of New Orleans, LA; and three grandchildren.
