Anne Marie passed away on Tuesday, January 21, 2025, in Omaha, Nebraska at the age of 89.

She is preceded in death by her husband Joseph A. Lesko; parents Jean and Marguerite,

Royale Hometel, Old Country Buffet, Donut Shop and was a home-based childcare provider for many years.

She was a loving wife, mother, known for her strong will, unwavering determination, and support for her family. She enjoyed cooking, listening to music, shopping, spa days, card games, movies, boating/beach, throwing parties, and traveling (i.e., Panama, Europe, States on the West & East Coast, the Midwest, and several cruises). She was sassy and FUN. Spending time with her family and friends was a high priority. She touched the lives of many throughout her lifetime. With her dear friends, the Fishes, there was an infamous long standing marble game that went on for over 50 years and the ladies always won.

Her passing leaves an unfillable void in her family lives, yet they will find comfort in the memories and everlasting love they shared.
