She will always remember working in the garden with him, fishing and how proud he was of her when she got her first deer. Art's oldest Gina may disagree with her little sister about being the "favorite" but she would definitely agree that fishing with Dad is a treasured memory. Being more of an indoor girl some of Gina's favorite time with her Dad was spent watching movies and talking. Art loved a good western or action movie almost as much as watching sports, especially football.

Art's family grew when his daughters met brothers Adam and Nick who became sons to him. With the arrival of Art's first grandchild, Dominic a new season in his life began. Everything was now about "the grandkids." They could do no wrong in his eyes and he was devoted to them.

Art would drive miles each day to get Dominic or as he affectionately called him "Bubba." Picking him up in his blue truck Dominic loved when Grandpa would let him drive it in the yard. The drive was worth it just so he could spend the day with him on the farm. Teaching his grandson to pee on his aunt's tires, drive the lawn mower, and wrestle. Art loved his new role in life.

When his granddaughter Sierra arrived, Art had a new partner in crime. They loved to prank each other, talk football, and watch WWE. Sierra will never forget the time her Grandpa Art cut all her shoelaces out of her new Jordan's. Just when Art thought he had his hands full his little cowboy, Anthony came along. He now had someone to share his love of "The Duke" with. Anthony and Grandpa could spend all day watching John Wayne movies, looking at guns and fishing.

With the arrival of Mariah Shea, Art now had a racing buddy. Mariah will always remember the trip her grandpa took with her too see a live NASCAR race or the time they went to Milford lake fishing.

After 43 years of marriage Iris will treasure the memories of time spent together with Art; watching Wheel of Fortune, laughing about the grandkids

and fighting over who ate the last of their favorite foods. Art would always say a “mouse must have ate it,” whenever the sweets where gone. Iris would say “Art you were up all night.” Art and Iris truly honored their wedding vows to care for each other in sickness and in health...through good times and bad. Taking turns being each other support and caregivers became a true testament of the love they shared for each other.
