Daniel was born on March 30, 1953, in York, NE to Raymond and Elaine Kohtz. He passed away on March 13, 2024.

Daniel grew up attending Zion Lutheran Church school in Hampton, NE, through 8th grade, and then he went on to High School in Bradshaw, graduating in 1971. He continued his education at the University of Nebraska Lincoln where he studied Mathematics and graduated with a Bachelor's followed by his Master's. During his time at college, he married Terri Janzen in 1974 at Zion Lutheran Church.

After graduating he went on to teach college level mathematics at The University of Arkansas at Monticello, Concordia College in Moorhead, MN, and the University of Nebraska at Omaha. After teaching for several years at UNO he transitioned to actuarial work at Mutual of Omaha where he worked for 30 plus years until he retired in 2017.

Daniel was a church treasurer for many years, as well as an active member of his church community. He coached and attended his children's school and extracurricular athletics and activities. He was an avid Husker fan from his childhood until his death.

Daniel was preceded in death by his parents, Raymond and Elaine Kohtz and

brother-in-law, Doug Carson. He is survived by his wife, Terri Kohtz; children, Sarah and Andrew Kohtz (Jackie Thomas); grandson, Preston Thomas-Kohtz; sisters, Diane Carson and Nancy Eberle (Gary) and numerous nieces and nephews.
