Doris Marie Lundy, aged 95, of Fremont, Nebraska, departed this world peacefully on November 20, 2025, leaving behind a profound legacy of love and quiet devotion.

Born on April 1, 1930, in Omaha, Nebraska, to Herbert Swan and Dorothy Swan, Doris matured in Omaha and completed her education at Omaha North High School in 1947. In June 1947, she married Charles Beaver. This union produced three children: Jerry Lee, Micheal Ray, and Diane Joy. Following their divorce in 1973, she married Duane Lundy on April 1, 1974 at the County Courthouse in Yankton, South Dakota, embarking on a shared journey marked by deep companionship and cherished family bonds.

Doris and Duane embraced a vibrant retirement, characterized by recreational vehicle travels that included winters in Texas and summers in Nebraska. They previously established their home in Valley, Nebraska, from 1974 to 1998. Yet, her most profound fulfillment arose from her unwavering commitment to her family's well-being.

Doris is eternally treasured by a vast and adoring family, who will forever hold dear her nurturing essence, whimsical humor, and resolute faith that every person deserves to be acknowledged, esteemed, and enveloped in love.
