Emily Marian (Woods) Mumm was born on July 28, 1911 in Belgrade, Nebraska to George and Gertrude (Thorpe) Woods. She grew up in Belgrade where she attended grade school and in Yutan where she graduated from high school in 1928. Emily went on to attend Peru State Teachers College. Emily taught at Union Hill Rural school near Rising City, Nebraska for three years, District #8 near Yutan for three years, District #38 for one semester, District #37 for over a year, Wann, Nebraska for one year and Yutan Elementary for 22 years of which ten years were Title I Reading.

Emily married Harvey Mumm on September 7, 1935 in Beatrice, Nebraska and to this union three children were born: Roger, Barbara and Alton. Emily and Harvey have always made their home in Yutan.

Emily enjoyed dancing, singing in the choir, tending her gardens, travelling and reading. She was active in her church, Saunders County Historical Society, the Girl Scouts and she was very involved in the lives of her grandchildren and great grandchildren. Emily was a kind and gentle woman and her family loved to visit her. She was proud that she persevered with her education, continuing her degree work from 1954 to 1969 at Midland College where she received a Bachelor Degree in Education. Then she pursued post graduate work at UNO in 1974 -75.

Emily passed away on Monday, July 14, 2008 at Arbor Manor in Fremont, Nebraska at the age of 96 years, 11 months and 16 days. She was preceded in death by her parents George and Gertrude, husband Harvey, son Roger, great grandson Jayse, brothers Lawrence, Holly and Cedric and sisters Dorothy Smith and Sarah Woods.
