Mary Imogene (VanEvery) Noyes was born on July 22, 1925 in Weeping Water, Nebraska to William and Mary VanEvery. She grew up in Weeping Water where she attended grade school and graduated from Weeping Water High School in 1943. Gene went on to study at the University of Omaha for several years.

Gene married Carlton Noyes on December 20, 1947 at the Waterloo Presbyterian Church in Waterloo, Nebraska and to this union three children were born: Kirk, Cindy and Craig. Gene and Carlton raised their family in the Valley area until the early 1970's when they moved to the Kearney area.

Gene worked at Mutual of Omaha for a while but she was an entrepreneur at heart. She was an antique dealer, owned Recessive Gene's Vintage Clothing and accessories in Omaha, and Down Home Gourmet Deli in Kearney. Gene enjoyed cooking, art, interior design, travel, reading, politics and an occasional spirited debate. She was active in the League of Women voters and Town and Country. Gene was creative and unique, a strong yet gentle woman. She loved her family, treasured the memories of her lifetime and was most happy when her family could be together to celebrate holidays.

Gene passed away on Friday, May 15, 2009 at the Mother Hull Home in Kearney, Nebraska at the age of 83 years, 9 months and 23 days. She was

preceded in death by her parents William and Mary and brother Russell VanEvery. Gene is survived by her husband of 62 years, Carlton H Noyes, her sons, Kirk Noyes and his wife, Jeanne; Craig Noyes and his wife Tara, all of Kearney and her daughter, Cindy Konopik and her husband Mike of Axtell, NE; 7 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren.
