



## George Albert Hurst

June 16, 1927 - April 10, 2013

George A. Hurst was born June 16, 1927 in Cleveland, Ohio and spent the majority of his school years in Washington, D.C. He served 8 years in the United States Marine Corps, serving in the Washington D.C. Headquarters, Ceremonial Squad, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, and China. Following his military service, he was a manager for two different divisions of Butler Manufacturing Company for 18 years. He was in Sales and Management with International Harvester for 18 years in Colorado, California, Arizona, and in Missouri, where he was a Retail Store Manager.

When George and Breta were married in 1983, they moved from Garden City, Kansas to Nebraska. They enjoyed their home in the Greenbrier area of Elkhorn, and in 2007, moved to their patio home at Pacific Springs Village. Until recent years, George was active in the Eastern Nebraska Gun Club, and was a member of the Millard American Legion Post#374. He was active the the Southwest Camp of the Gideon's International, and a member of Westside Church. George was diagnosed with lung cancer in 2011, and remained at home with the help of the VNA Hospice Team until 3 days before he died, April 10, 2013 at the Josie Harper Hospice House.
