George and Mableann were active in square dancing with the Westernaires and loved their off-season travels. He was active in the Masons and Shriners and was an avid Husker fan. George was a people person who never met a stranger. He was outgoing and charismatic yet humble. George loved his family and always had a cookie for the grandchildren. He enjoyed pineapple upside down cake and diner out at Jimbo's Diner.

George passed away at his home in Yutan, Nebraska at the age of 79 years,

10 months and 24 days. He was preceded in death by his parents Otto and Adeline, his wife Mableann, brothers Richard and Conrad and sisters Phyllis and Ardith.
