



Harold Vaughan Glandt

April 25, 1936 - January 31, 2024

Harold Vaughan Glandt passed away peacefully at age 87 on January 31, 2024. His parents, Arthur R. Glandt and Maude Vaughan (Fremont, NE), were from Bennington, NE. He was born in Lincoln, NE at Immanuel Hospital where he spent three weeks in an incubator with his identical twin, Darrold. He was the larger twin, weighing 4 lbs. and 12 oz.

Harold had many jobs including running the milk bottles up to houses for the milkman in Bennington with his brother, Darrold. He worked at Pepsi and for Yano at Caniglia's when it was just a carhop. He was a builder with his family but broke away to become a lineman at OPPD where he retired after 41 years. He was known for being the "King of Overtime." He played softball on an OPPD team called the "Heavy Gang." He was also active in the Army National Guard for three years.

He considered Bennington his hometown but moved to Scottsbluff for a few years before moving to Omaha. He graduated from Norseman/North in 1954 where he was on the wrestling and track teams. He loved his '57 Chevy that he had fun racing.

Harold married the love of his life, Sharon L. Brunmeier, on August 30, 1958 at Mt. Olive Lutheran Church. They built a family together in Omaha having three children: Kim, Pam, and Curt. He was a true family man, prioritizing his loved ones first and foremost. They were active members of Mount View Presbyterian Church. He was a huge sports fan and watched every Nebraska football game. The family was active in gardening, camping, fishing, hunting,

water and snow skiing, swimming, and many other sports. They were able to build a new home on 61st Avenue where they raised their family, and then purchased an acreage outside of Bennington in 1988. The acreage became a lifestyle for them with several large vegetable gardens to tend, tons of grass to mow, and countless pets and animals to care for and love. How many tomato plants are too many?!

Harold was known for his affinity to food and being a great cook – feeding others was most definitely his love language. He would stuff everyone that came over until they could pop! Family and friends have many recipes that he was proud to share. There were always bowls of candy, or as he called it “pogey bait”, around every corner.

He was the master of one-liners, could outwit anyone, loved to tell jokes and make people smile and laugh. He had a wonderful smile, a warm heart, and gave big hugs.

Harold was preceded in death by wife Sharon, his twin brother Darrold (Rosa) Glandt and brother William (Marlu) Glandt. He is survived by daughters and sons-in-law: Kim (Ed) McEachen of Rogers, AR and Pam (Lee) Camenzind of Bennington; son Curtis Glandt of Bennington; 7 grandchildren and 8 great grandchildren.
