Jean Delores Biesendorfer was born on June 30, 1921 in Omaha, Nebraska to Victor Andrew Christensen and Hattie Amanda Schulz. She graduated from Omaha North High School and held several jobs attending school, cleaning homes and working at JC Penney's. Jean was baptized at St. Luke's in Omaha and confirmed at Our Redeemer in Omaha, joining St. John's Lutheran Church after moving to Bennington in 1954.

Jean married Joseph Harry on December 31, 1941 and followed some of his travels in the Army including Kansas City and Kentucky. After Harry left the Army, they settled in Omaha. Five children were born to Jean and Harry; Joseph Harry, Carol Jean, Lee Alan, James Rae and David Lynn.

Jean loved to crochet and donated many potholders to the Harvest Supper Bake Sale. She also loved fishing with Harry in Minnesota, playing pinochle and reading. She worked as the church secretary for many years, was active in the Alter Guild, the church choir, superintendent of the Vacation Bible School and taught Sunday School.

Jean passed away on Memorial Day, May 26, 2014 at the Immanuel Hospital in Omaha at the age of 92 years, 10 months and 26 days.
