John Leo Laughlin was born at home on December 22, 1940 in Imogene, Iowa to Joseph and Mary (Head) Laughlin. John's life was guided by his faith in Jesus. He had a great sense of humor and was a sincerely caring man. In his life, he formed many deep, long-lasting friendships. He quietly assisted many people in need without ever drawing attention to himself. Many friends and family often sought after John for his caring, wise advice. He was a man of his word and championed integrity. John was also an avid proponent of the protection of the unborn.
