July 3, 1930 - April 17, 2009

Joseph James Sacco was born on July 3, 1930 in Omaha, Nebraska to Joseph and Mildred (Ruebsmen) Sacco. Joe grew up in the Florence area of North Omaha where he attended grade school at Clifton Hills Grade School and graduated from North High School in 1948. As a young boy, Joe enjoyed hanging out with friends, playing ball and fishing. After high school Joe served his country in the United States Army from 1951-1953, serving in Korea. After his return, Joe enrolled at Omaha University.

Joe married Beverly Moravec on June 1, 1957 at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Omaha, Nebraska and to this union one daughter was born: Teri. Joe and Beverly lived in Omaha before moving to Elkhorn in 1962. Joe remained in his home until 3 years ago when his health required that he move to receive more assistance.

Joe worked a variety of jobs, including a short time at Bryce's Horseradish, but mostly at Omaha Grain Exchange and then at Gate City Steel with his brothers and father. After his years in service, he went to work for the United States Postal Service where he remained until his retirement 29 years later. Joe enjoyed bird watching, playing his harmonicas, model airplanes, chess, the Chicago Cubs, traveling, Indian History, playing cards and bowling. He had a tremendous sense of humor and loved to tell jokes. But most of all, he treasured his time with family, many of whom affectionately called him "Duck". Joe passed away on Friday, April 17, 2009 at the Methodist Hospital in Omaha, Nebraska at the age of 78 years, 9 months and 14 days. He was

preceded in death by his parents Joe and Mildred, wife Beverly and brother Frank. Joe is survived by daughter and son-in-law Teri and Chris Cain and Granddaughters Eleanor and Adelaide of Omaha; brother and sister-in-law William and Charlene of Fremont; sister Charlotte Gustin of Omaha and sister-in-law Kathy Elkins of Texas.
