Lee married Andra Grinvalds on May 23, 1981 at St. John's Lutheran Church in Yutan and they were blessed with a daughter, Jamie. Lee and Andra have made their home in Yutan and Valley.

Lee has worked for local farmers, Valmont and at 3-M as a forklift operator for over 30 years. He continued his love of the outdoors, hunting and fishing, mushroom hunting at his secret spot, was an avid sports fan especially cheering on his beloved Yankees and Huskers.
