Lois A. (Shaver) Rogert was born on March 8, 1926 in Emerson, Nebraska to DeWitt and Hazel (Hoisington) Shaver. She grew up in Emerson where she attended school through the 11th Grade. Lois was very patriotic and could often be heard proclaiming "In God We Trust".

Lois passed away on Sunday, November 4, 2012 at her home near Waterloo, Nebraska with her family by her side at the age of 86 years, 7 months and 26
