



Lori Kay Clements

June 16, 1960 - October 9, 2022

Lori Clements passed away peacefully in her sleep the morning of Sunday, October 9th. She is survived by her mother, Arloene Gieber, her husband, Kipp Clements, her children Dustin Clements, Camilla (Phillip) Brown, Derek (Lianne) Clements, Calli (Travis) Webster, and her grandchildren Chadrick, Caedmon and Evan Brown, Calvyn and Lincoln Clements, and Clarkeson, Hazel and Beckett Webster.

Lori was born in Tooele, Utah and was raised in Wendover, Utah. She met her husband, Kipp during their high school years. The high school sweethearts were married shortly after graduation and started their family in Salt Lake City, celebrating the birth of their eldest children, Dustin and Camilla. Lori and her family later relocated to Denver where her youngest children, Derek and Calli were born, before relocating again to Omaha.

Those who were blessed to know Lori knew that she showed her love through service. Lori was very involved in her community, serving as a volunteer in her church, local schools and the American Cancer

Society. A two-time breast cancer survivor, she focused much of her volunteer efforts in Reach to Recovery, helping provide support for those battling breast cancer, and Race For The Cure, raising thousands of dollars to help find a cure. She was always seen wearing pink in support of the cause.

Lori was also very active in her church community and was a faithful member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. She volunteered multiple times a week at the Winter Quarter's Temple, working in the temple office to coordinate saving ordinances for countless individuals. Additionally she and her husband served as local service missionaries helping those in the local community struggling with addictions to overcome their struggles.

A viewing will be held from 6-8PM on Friday, October 14th at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints at 17606 Spaulding Street Omaha NE 68116. A funeral service will be held Saturday, October 15th from 10AM-11AM at the same location with a burial service for family only to follow after.

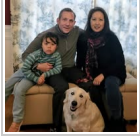
