



## Lucille Monica Christiansen

Lucille M. (Mishak) Christiansen was born October 14, 1928 in Omaha, Nebraska. At the age of 4, Lucille was adopted by Stanley and MaryAnn Mishak, and was raised in their South Omaha home. Lucille attended Ashland Elementary Grade School and Omaha South High School. As a young girl, Lucille won an Annie Oakley B.B. Gun Award.

Somehow, everything always seemed to match the color of her eyes, and she always gave unselfishly or herself.
