From 1995 to 2012, Lynda was deeply involved with EVW, leading fundraising efforts and running the concession stand. She was also the ultimate football mom, making sure every player was taken care of, encouraged, and supported.

Professionally, Lynda dedicated over 30 years to Carlson Hospitality, where she worked in resource planning. After her time there, she continued to show the same passion and dedication while working for Blue Cross Blue Shield, leaving a positive impact on everyone she worked with.

Lynda was passionate about giving back and volunteered in many charity runs throughout her years of running and walking. Even during her battle with liver cancer, she remained incredibly strong. During chemotherapy treatments, she walked a full marathon — a powerful testament to her courage and determination.
