Mary Jo always worked hard, early on she de-tasseled then when the children came she was a full time Mom. After raising her family, Mary Jo returned to work at Mutual of Omaha, Douglas County Annex, Douglas County Gazette and she was a photographer for All-American. Then she was a substitute rural mail carrier before taking over the route full time before retiring from the US Postal Service. Mary Jo had a great love of the outdoors. She enjoyed all that nature provided. She enjoyed reading, painting and collecting. In her later years, Mary Jo took up Power Lifting and was a National Champion in her age group.
