Patricia Marie (Sutej) Jacobberger was born November 30, 1922 in Omaha, Nebraska to James and Anna (Aller) Sutej. Pat's family was the most important thing to her, and she relished every moment of being the most kind, compassionate, and loving mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother that she could be.

Pat enjoyed many hobbies throughout her life. She was a bowler, cook, and card player. She enjoyed music and writing, and was a golfer who once shot a hole in one at the Meadowbrook Golf Course, where she was a member. Pat was known for her sense of humor, and had the unique ability to make everyone feel like they were the most important person in the world. She loved watching and feeding their wild birds, and was happiest when surrounded by her family.

Pat passed away on September 17, 2007 at the Nebraska Methodist Hospital in Omaha at the age of 84 years, 9 months, and 18 days. She was preceded in death by her father, James Sutej.
