With deep sorrow and immense love, we share the passing of Phil Milone, who left us far too soon on February 25, 2026 at the age of 50. Though his time here was shorter than we ever expected, he filled it with fun, laughter, and a love for his children that will never fade.

He was born on February 1, 1976 in Omaha, NE to Maggie Osborn and Mike Milone. After graduating from Millard North High School in 1994, Phil attended The University of Nebraska at Omaha, graduating with a Bachelor's Degree in Management of Information Systems Degree in 1999. He then went onto have a meaningful career at Boys Town, impacting many lives for 27 years.

Phil grew into a man known for his generous heart, strong opinions about husker football, and a quiet strength that held his family together even when life felt uncertain. He believed that love was something you showed—not just something you said.

If you walked into his home, chances are you would find him in the kitchen. Cooking wasn't just a hobby for him; it was his love language. He cooked the way he lived—fully invested. Feeding people was his way of caring for them. No one ever left his table hungry.

When he wasn't cooking, he was often fishing whether it was alone or with the many people he loved, always coming back with stories to tell. Often embellished.

But above all else, Phil loved his children, Gabrielle, Dominic and Victoria. Being a father was his greatest joy. He was endlessly proud of all they were

becoming. He showed his love in everyday moments – offering advice (whether asked for or not), fixing what was broken, and reminding them that a late-night ice cream run was just a call away.

He married Tamra Milone on August 11, 2001. Although he and his wife were separated, some bonds run deeper than circumstance. Their shared history, their family, and the love they built through their children remained meaningful to them and they remained very close friends.

Phil's passing leaves an ache that words cannot measure. There will be milestones he should have been here for, conversations we wish we could still have, and hugs we weren't ready to let go of. He was taken from us too soon, but his strength lives on in his children and all the lives he touched. His stories will be told for generations.

He was preceded in death by his father Michael Milone, grandparents Tony & Beverly Milone, and uncle Pat Milone. Phil is survived by wife Tamra, children: Gabrielle, Dominic and Victoria; his mother Maggie Osborn; brother Paul (Catherine) Milone and sister Kelly Peterson; and many aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces and nephews; as well as his very best cuz Chandra Marks, his special person Allison Shaw, and so many close friends.

Celebration of life services will be held Saturday, March 7 at Noon at Reichmuth Funeral Home in Elkhorn, with visitation from 10 AM to Noon prior to the service. Interment will be at Prospect Hill Cemetery, Elkhorn. Memorials may be made to the family.

From that unmistakable, full-body laugh to his legendary pranks, Phil didn't just attend events he upgraded them all. What our family cherished most was that no matter what life threw at us, or how it pulled us in different directions, Phil made sure we never lost the traditions that mattered. Chief among them was our sacred, slightly over-the-top, unapologetically loud and proud Fourth of July neighborhood celebration. Fireworks, food, friends, and at least one heated debate about who ate all of Phil's famous cheesy shrimp (we're looking at you, Lex!). This year's blowout was one for the ages, complete with a day-long hog roast. Granted, at our age, "day-long" also included strategically timed naps for both of us which we confidently dismissed as good party management. Over the decades, our families grew up together our kids making memories while we made sure the grill never went cold and the beers never got warm. Man he loved his kiddos and loved each of ours, and that's allot to love! That's why he kept the traditions going, he knew that this was the glue that kept us all together, familiy. Those moments, the laughter, the chaos, the backyard parties and the many stories that probably shouldn't be repeated are treasures we'll hold onto forever. Like the "flounder" we caught off the Carolina coast using a full chicken breast as bait. To be fair, we're not entirely sure we trying to fish. We mostly just sat on that pier for hours, drinking beer and laughing like schoolgirls, irritating every serious fisherman within earshot. Or the time you loaded all the kids into the back of your pickup to cruise around the state park while we were camping. That game warden chewed you out so thoroughly, I'm pretty sure he might still be finishing the lecture somewhere. And then there was the food. Being Italian, Phil made the most unbelievably good meals, the kind that made you close your eyes on the first bite. But would he share the recipes? Absolutely not. "I don't use recipes," he'd always say. "I just throw things together." Maybe that was true, but we always asked anyway. Phil had a rare gift: he showed up. Always. For everyone. He made

time, he made memories, and he made us laugh when we needed it most. And most of all, he was our best friend. The kind you thank God for, and the kind you never really say goodbye to, because a laugh that big echoes for a long, long time.
