Roland R. Lord was born September 22, 1916 in McCool Junction, Nebraska to Robert and Gladys (Bellows) Lord. He grew up in McCool Junction, and graduated from McCool High School in 1934. Following high school, Roland earned his Bachelor's of Science Degree in Business from the University of Nebraska in Lincoln.

Roland married Mildred Mullner on October 15, 1939. The couple had two daughters: Marlene and Sandy. They resided in Norfolk for 58 years before moving to an assisted living facility in Elkhorn.

Roland served in the United States Navy from 1944 to 1945 during World War II. Following his return home from the War, Roland worked the State of Nebraska Rehabilitation Services for 30 years, retiring in 1979 as the Norfolk area manager. After retiring, Roland and Mildred spent many winters in Lake Placid, Florida, where they enjoyed fishing, and playing golf, cards, and bingo with their many friends.

Roland was a 50 year member of the Oddfellows, and he and Mildred were long time members of the United Methodist Church in Norfolk. He was preceded in death by Mildred in 2010. Roland is survived by his daughters: Marlene Louis of Elkhorn, and Sandy (Fran) Bulawa of Newcastle, WY, 7 grandchildren, 17 great grandchildren, and sisters: Dorothy Hendricks of McCool Junction, NE, and Gladys Mae (Glenn) Phillips of Benedict, NE, and many nieces and nephews.
