In 1995 I was having health problems due to diabetes. I had not taken very good care of myself and was having eye complications due to the disease. Margo and my parents had tried to get me on the insulin pump, but I was skeptical. I saw Ron that spring at a trial at Branched Oak. Ron showed me his insulin pump, explained how it worked and how it had improved his life. Ron gave us the number of his doctor at Creighton University. We went to Dr. Rendell and through his help got on the insulin pump.

I have Ron to thank for my eyesight. The pump has stabilized my glucose levels. Had it not been for his encouragement, I do not believe I would have gone on the pump, stabilized my sugars and have the amount of eyesight I currently have.

As you know, Ron was straight to the point and you did not have to guess where he stood. I really respected and liked Ron for that. He was a good friend to us and a good man.
