Russell Fred Logemann was born on April 30, 1914 in Bennington, Nebraska to Wilhelm and Elsie (Petersen) Logemann. He grew up on the family farm near 156th and Ida St. and attended District #40 school. As a young man, Russell helped his father with the farm operation.

Russell married Margaret Heise on June 2, 1938 at her parent's home in Benson, Nebraska and to this union three children were born: Carol, Dale and Ray. Russell and Margaret raised their family on farms south of Bennington.

Russell was a life long farmer, still enjoying a day at the farm in his nineties. Farming was not only his vocation but his hobby. Russell was a 4-H leader, enjoyed playing cards, dancing and dinners out. He was the first man to sign up for the Farm Bureau program in Douglas County but he had to go to West Point to accomplish this. Russell was as member of Zion Lutheran Church and served as church treasurer and on the property board. He was a colorful man, hardworking and of strong faith. Russell was a dedicated husband and father who treasured family and personal relationships. He loved his time with Margaret and was always looking after the well being of his family.

Russell passed away on Sunday, February 24, 2008 at the Life Care Center of Elkhorn, Nebraska at the age of 93 years, 9 months and 25 days. He was preceded in death by his parents Wilhelm and Elsie and brother Lester. He is
