Sharon Lee Glandt, age 79 of Omaha, died on Friday, September 14, 2018 at Nebraska Methodist Hospital in Omaha. Then along came her grandchildren. She helped raise four of the seven with love and keeping them busy with cooking, chores, sports, and animals from dogs, cats, rabbits and a faithful horse, "Bee". Although she was a great cook, she preferred to be outside in the yard. Her and Harold were joined at the hip for over 60 years, hardly doing anything apart unless it was shopping. Sharon loved cheering on the Huskers with the entire family and also watching golf whenever her cousin, Ryan Moore, was on TV. Her favorite pastime was watching old westerns, especially ones with John Wayne, and musicals. She played tennis for twenty years making tons of friends and being an organizer for the West Omaha Tennis League. She played mixed doubles with her family and they will never forget her encouragement, big smile and great backhands! 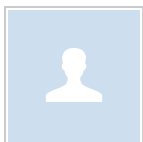
