Thomas L. “Tom” Harrie was born October 19, 1951 in Fremont, Nebraska to Irvin and Ruth (Dunklau) Harrie. Tom grew up in the Millard area, and attended Millard schools, graduating from Millard High School in 1970. He went on to attend the University of Nebraska in Lincoln, and Concordia College, earning his Bachelor’s degree. Growing up, Tom stayed active playing sports and was a fan of local stock car racing.

Tom married Marilee Higginbotham on April 16, 1983 in Omaha, Nebraska, and to this union, two sons were born; Jacob and Joseph “Joey”. Tom was also like a dad to Marilee’s daughter, Shannon. They made their home in Omaha. Tom then moved to Waterloo, Nebraska after he and Marilee divorced in June 1994. The two remained friends.

Tom worked at Boystown, then worked for many years at 3M in Valley, Nebraska, where he was involved with the 3M Club.

Tom was a kind, cheerful, adventurous man, who was a loyal friend, and always had a smile on his face and seemed happy. He was very outgoing, and loved to meet new people and share conversations with them. He loved NASCAR and local stock car racing, all Nebraska sports, and especially rides on his motorcycle. He was known for his greeting of “Howdy, howdy, howdy. How it going?” Tom never turned down a dinner at El Bee’s and enjoyed a cold Miller Lite, or some wings. He could talk to anyone, and enjoyed learning and sharing the history of Nebraska. He will be remembered for his friendly, outgoing nature, and above all, he cherished his two sons.

Tom passed away unexpectedly on Tuesday, November 15, 2022 at the age of 71 years, 27 days. He was preceded in death by his parents Irvin and Ruth Harrie, sister Carol Reddick, and the mother of his children, Marilee Higginbotham. Tom is survived by his two sons Jacob of Lafayette, CO, and Joseph of Omaha, and his brother and sister-in-law David and Lesa Harrie of Elkhorn

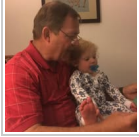
